

"What a Difference a Preposition Makes!" Luke 10:38-42

Careful to Pinpoint the Intended Contrast

Intake or output? Contemplation or activism? Monk or missionary?

The importance of intake: zealous without knowledge: Romans 10:2-3

The importance of output: be doers, not hearers only: James 1:22

Today's thesis: doing things WITH Jesus is better than doing things FOR Jesus

Doing Things FOR Jesus (Martha Mode)

Certainly there is a place to do something for Jesus: see Mark 14:3-9

The performative mindset of pleasing and appearing

Where I concoct and initiate things that I think will please Jesus

Something prepared apart from Him in order to bring it to Him (surprise party)

'Gain favor by earning, 'appease negativity by flattery, 'sway action by bribery

This approach tends to be 'independent ("welcomed Him into her house")

"The type of serving is ironically self-centered ("Tell her to help me")

"Exhausting ('distracted with much serving," 'anxious & troubled about many things')

Doing Things WITH Jesus (Mary Mode)

Jesus modeled with the twelve what He wants for all His followers

He desires to be with us and, out of that, empower us for service: Mark 3:13-15

He calls us 'friends' and not servants: John 15:35

'Instead of earning favor, we are already in ('sit at Jesus' feet')

"Since Jesus needs nothing, we don't add to Jesus, but He to us ('listen to Him')

"This approach doesn't offer Jesus innovations but follows Jesus' lead

"This approach is Christ-centered, attention on what Jesus is doing

"This approach is sustainable, fueled with the energy that comes from Him

Herein lies the better portion, the one necessary thing: Lake 10:42

Practically How Do I Do Things with an Invisible Jesus?

Time alone with heart and mind receptive to Jesus: Luke 6:12

Time with fellow Jesus-followers: Matthew 18:20

Responding to what Jesus is already doing: Peter and Cornelius in Acts 10
