#### The Corinthian Community Paul is Shaping

- 1. Shared reality of deficiency: 1 Cor 1:26-29
- 2. Equal recipients of the crazy grace of the cross of Jesus: 1 Cor 1:23-34, 30-31
- 3. God's preference to work through "the things that are not": 1 Cor 1:28
- 4. An understanding that God gets the glory in this way: 1 Cor 25,29,31

Paul names his own fear, trembling weakness: 1 Cor 2:1-4 (see also 2 Cor 12:7-10)

## The Difference Between a Vulnerable Culture and a Wallowing Culture

But aren't we supposed to grow in maturity and not remain perpetually "weak"?

Jesus has called us on a journey of progressive wholeness

While our boast always remains in the Lord: 1 Cor 1:31; John 15:5

A look at my own life reinforces the notion against "arriving" on this side

The nature of climbing: slow up, fast down!

Humility remains warranted from the vantage point of cliff dwellers

A 30-year sober man still introduces himself as an alcoholic

The paradox of great spiritual maturity as awareness of the near-by edge
